# From the Town Supervisor:

#### **New Property for Stafford Park**

The town has just recently acquired the house and barn on Route 11 by Stafford Park with the intention of adding the property to the park and developing a new community center on the site. Below is an initial design of potential use for the property including parking and building space. The town is working with all stakeholders including the Optimist Club to make sure we get the most use out of this new property and hope to make Stafford Park truly the center of our great town and the place to be for community events.



#### **Town Surplus**

In January we closed the books on the first year of our new board and supervisor. We had a great year financially - thanks to the hard work of John Greeley, Steve Robson, and our LaFayette Highway Department and our partners in the county, especially Legislature Chairman Dave Knapp, we finished the year with more than \$300,000.00 in surplus in the highway budget. That money will be put aside for any major purchases in the future, like new trucks or repairs to the garage. This will be a major offset of future taxes. In addition, all other budget lines ran a five figure surplus. All in all, a very positive year for town finances.

#### **Association of Towns - NYC**

In February, I travelled to NYC for the Association of Towns annual meeting. This is a meeting of the 932 towns across NYS and an opportunity for the towns to voice their collective opinion on matters impacting town government at the state level. The main focus of myself and others is the proposal by Governor Cuomo to cut AIM funding, or roughly 1%

of our town's budget. For the time being, it looks like our efforts have been successful and that proposal has been stalled. We will continue to keep an eye on the matter and do all we can to avoid the state taking money away from us.



# From the Town Supervisor cont'd.....

#### Potential Solar Farm - Apulia Rd. and Palladino Rd.

Cypress Creek, a solar farming, green energy company has approached the town about putting in a solar farm on Apulia Rd. near Palladino Rd. They have already agreed to do all they can to keep the site aesthetically appealing as possible which is a good first step on working with the town. The solar energy production, should the planned site move forward, would allow residents who opt in to reduce their electricity bills by as much as 15%. The issue will be discussed further at our next planning board meeting for those who wish to have their opinions heard on the matter.



#### **New Town Attorney**



I would like to welcome aboard the town's newest employee - Attorney Jeff Brown. Jeff has a tremendous track record of success and will be a huge asset to our team. Jeff used to represent LaFayette in the NYS Assembly, is an officer in the 174th Fighter Wing, and represents the Town of Pompey

and Village of Marcellus. The board and myself are thrilled to have Jeff as part of the team and I expect we will accomplish a lot together.

#### **Trash Opt Outs**

There continues to be some confusion on trash opt outs - those who own or lease a dumpster or are a business or a farm are allowed to opt out of the trash service as long as they provide a receipt to the clerk and return their opt out form. You can always call with questions.

# SHREDDING / MEDICATION DISPOSAL / RECUSE MISSION DROP OFF

#### May 11th from 9am-1pm LaFayette Town Hall

The Town Board again has agreed to offer this free *SHREDDING* service to residents, including businesses. Please bring your personal paperwork, business files, tax returns, statements & bills, etc. to the **Town Hall upper parking lot**. Your papers are shredded on site, you can watch via a video camera that is attached to the truck; then the shredded papers are secured and taken to a waste



management site for recycling. This saves you time, saves our environment and gives you piece of mind that your personal documents are secure.

# From the Town Clerk cont'd....

After dropping off your shredding come inside the **Town Hall Lobby** for *MEDICATION DISPOSAL* to safely get rid of your unwanted and *expired* drugs or *medications*. 70% of people who abuse prescription drugs get them from friends or relatives, so let's avoid this happening in our homes. With all of the prescription drug abuse we hear of, let's get them disposed of properly for the safety of our kids, families and environment. **NO SHARPS PLEASE!** 

This was a huge success last year so we are having another **RESCUE MISSION DROP OFF AT THE TOWN** 

<u>HALL</u> in combination with the shredding and medication disposal. You may drop off everything from small furniture,



blankets, clothes, etc. for the Rescue Mission at the Town Hall. While you are spring cleaning & cleaning out closets, instead of taking it to the landfill site, please drop them off at the Town Hall. Please be sure things are clean and in good condition. (No junk please.)

FACILITIES RENTAL – thank you again to the LaFayette Optimist Club for all they do and have done at Stafford Park!! The two pavilions book up quickly with graduation parties, family & class reunions, birthday & anniversary parties and even weddings. If you are interested in renting either of the Stafford Park pavilions or the Community Center, I advise you to act quickly to reserve them. The fee for residents is still only \$100.00, nonresidents or businesses \$250 plus the deposit.

MARRIAGE LICENSES - Please check our website for forms &instructions. Please call for an appointment.

PASSPORTS Application is available on-line at <a href="http://travel.state.gov">http://travel.state.gov</a>, or in my office. Please call to schedule an appointment to process passport applications. Renew your passport by mail yourself if your current passport isn't over 5 years expired with five easy steps and form DS-82 at website above.

HANDICAP PERMITS – Applications available here or at your doctor's office.

**DOG LICENSING** Just a reminder: <u>ALL DOGS MUST BE</u> <u>LICENSED per NYS LAW</u>. You have the option of licensing your dog for one to three years. The cost per year is \$8.00 for spayed and neutered dogs and \$20.00 for unspayed and unneutered dogs. When doing a multiple year license, the license expiration date must

be before the expiration date of the rabies vaccination. Replacement tag fee: \$3.00; Impoundment fee: \$150.00. Please be responsible for your pets. Dog Control Officers: Ken Johnson (315) 263-1000 and Laura Holt (315) 696-6468.

If you have any questions or situations involving a dog, please call dog control. If you have a concern regarding wild-life animals, you may call (607) 753-3095. If you see any suspicious/strange acting animals (possible rabies) please contact the Department of Environmental Conservation Police at (315) 426-7431.

Happy Spring from the Highway Department. Below are some important dates as we move through April—May—June.



• Annual Brush Pick-up: April 1st through April 26th—Putt butt end out first (no longer than 8'). Please no bagged leaves or wood with nails as the highway recycles this material for mulch. Mulch will be available to residents for "free" starting May 4th. All trees and branches that are cut by contractors are the contractor's responsibility to move. There is no need to call as the Highway Department will travel all roads. Please work on getting all

brush out by the end of March.

• Earth Day — In celebration of Earth Day, please consider volunteering to clean up one of our town roads. The Highway Department will be open on Friday, April 26 from 6:30 am—3:00 pm and again on Saturday April 27 from 9:00 am—2:00 pm for drop off. 



We continue to offer computer training for our patrons. This is a one on one session by appointment only. Please call 677-3782 and ask for Scott to make arrangements.






# From the LaFayette Advisory Conservation Commission

#### LaFayette's 4 Corners - Let's Save & Improve Them!

Back around 2012, NYS Department of Transportation (DOT) drafted plans for widening the roadway at the 4 corners in LaFayette. The DOT's planned road expansion would bring increased large truck traffic through our Town's main intersection (Routes 11 and 20) and it would change the historic form of LaFayette. The historic homes and church would face an unattractive, huge expanse of truck-filled roadway (see below).



A better plan, that still allows easy truck turns, simply moves the "STOP" lines on the roadway back enough to allow large trucks to clear sitting traffic. Our historic Hamlet can be preserved, and rehabilitating the historic streetscape with trees, sidewalks with shorter and safer crosswalk distances, and on-street parking, is a better design solution for our Town center (see below).



This year (2019), NYS DOT has put the LaFayette Roadway Intersection Project on its "to do" list. Let's not let a huge roadway expansion become a sad reality when we can have a more attractive and walkable hamlet center that better supports economic development and quality of life at the heart of our Town. If we let NYS know what we want before the project moves forward, we can get a much better intersection design, true to our Town's Comprehensive Plan.

#### **Youth Programs:**



The **Town of LaFayette** has joined with the **HeatSmart CNY** campaign to help make it easier for residents to switch to high efficiency heat pump heating and cooling systems.

Heat pumps are devices that look like central A/C units or furnaces, but are able to heat and cool VERY efficiently. Unlike conventional heating which burns fossil fuels to heat a home, heat pumps work by bringing heat from the outside into our homes. That heat might be from the ground for ground-source (or "geothermal") heating, or from the outside air, even as low as -13° F! These systems can be up to 400% more efficient than conventional heating methods.

The HeatSmart CNY campaign will be holding workshops and open houses in the area in March and April, including one here at the town offices. Anyone heating with propane, oil, or electric resistance should really consider attending!
